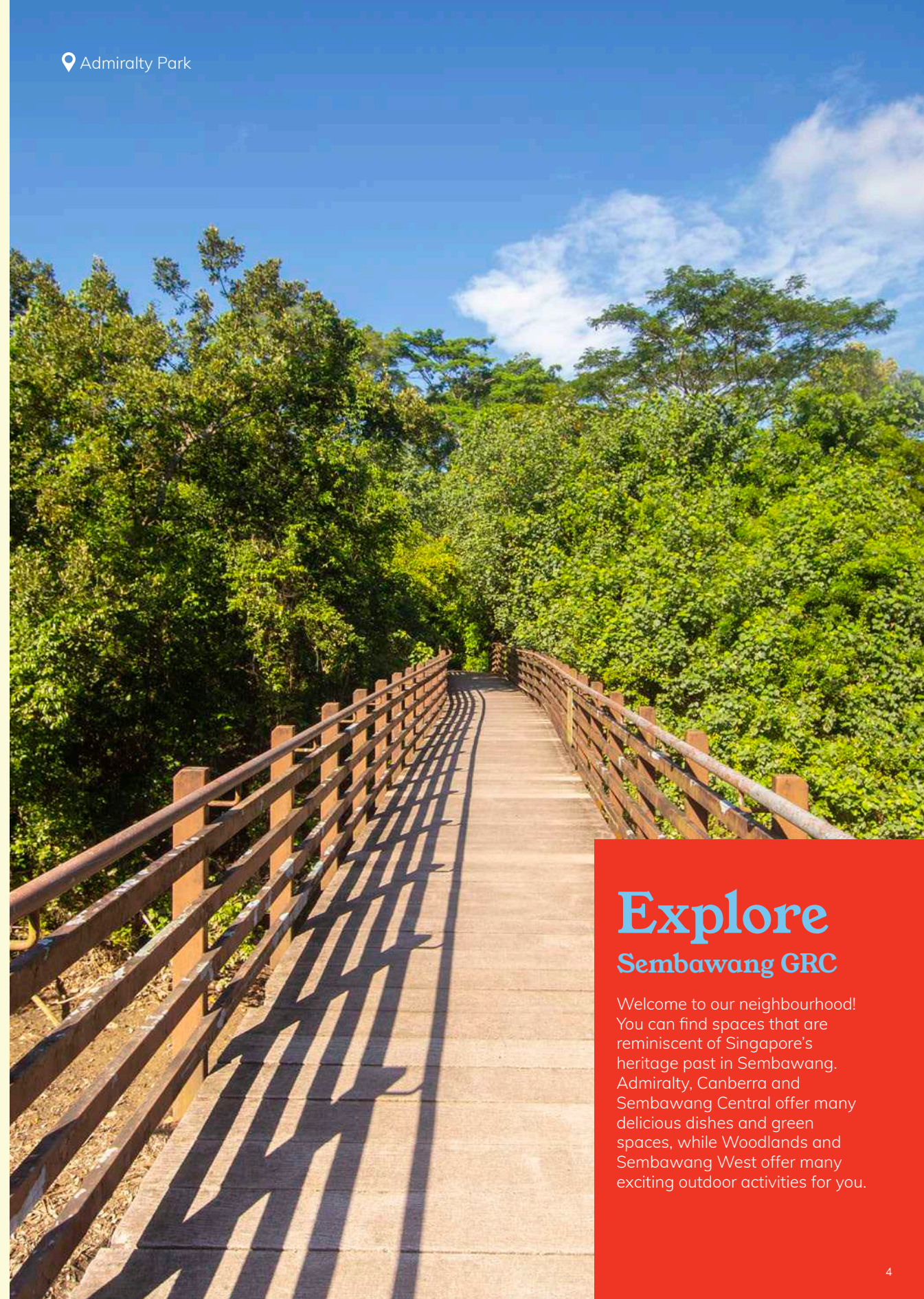
THE OLD & THE NEW

DEEPLY WOVEN HERITAGE

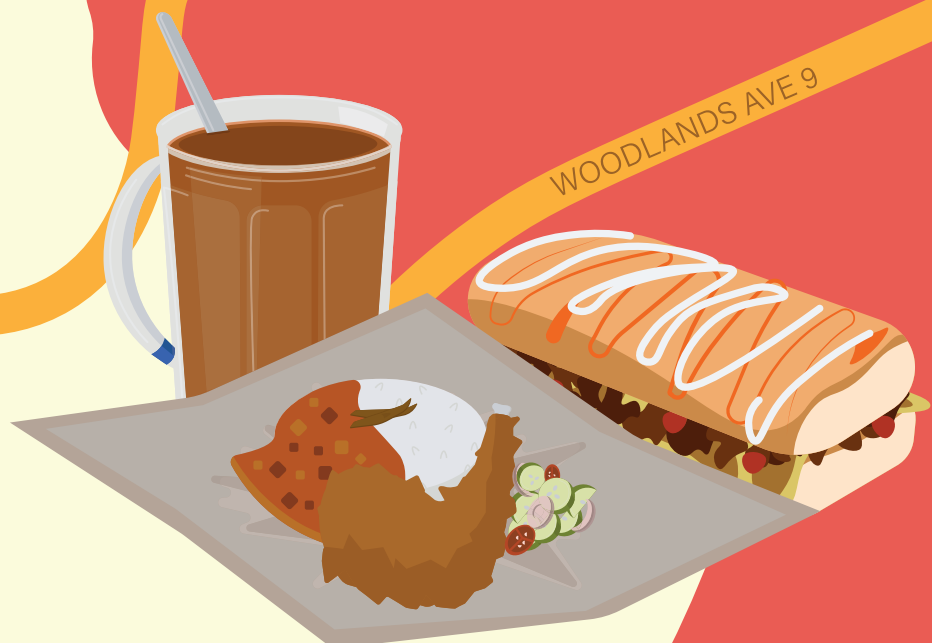
📍 Sembawang GRC

Located in the North of Singapore, our World War II and colonial past is present in the remnants of the naval and military related structures, as well as the black-and-white colonial bungalows in Sembawang. A naval base in the 1900s, Sembawang was developed into dockyards, wharves as well as supporting residential and commercial areas.

Sembawang Road was built to connect the area to central Singapore. The road formed the spine where many businesses and eateries flourished, including Sembawang Village and the popular Sembawang Strip. Today, Sembawang is more than just history, but also a hub for leisure and play!

The way we live, work and play are influenced by our heritage. Understand the past to appreciate the present!



1 RUBBER PLANTATIONS

An important livelihood in the 19th Century.

In the early 19th century, Chinese settlers cultivated gambier and pepper in the area of Sembawang and eventually switched to pineapple and rubber. There were some prominent estates, including Hock San, a pineapple and rubber plantation belonging to Tan Kah Kee that was along Sembawang Road (Seletar Road previously), and Woodfield (near Senoko Industrial Estate today) which was established by a Swedish municipal inspector, Oscar Oslen. As more people worked in Sembawang, they started to set up homes in the area.

2 THE SEMBAWANG TREE

Where our name comes from.

The name "Sembawang" comes from the Sembawang tree (*Mesua ferruginea*). The trees were commonly seen in Sungei Sembawang up to the 20th century before plantations took over the landscape. However, you can still find them standing today in Sembawang Park.



3 CHONG PANG VILLAGE

A bustling neighbourhood now, a lively village then.

Demolished in 1989, Chong Pang Village was home to 100,000 residents. The village stood where Sembawang Town is today. The Chong Pang town centre was where villagers gathered for food, met friends and purchased necessities. The name now survives on as Chong Pang City, a part of Yishun New Town.

REMNANTS OF OUR MILITARY PAST

A naval base in 1922.

In 1922, Sembawang was selected as the site for a naval base to protect the British Far East. Many people of different nationalities—Malayalees from Kerala, Tamils, Cantonese from Hong Kong—settled in the area to work at the dockyard. Today, you can still visit the bunkers as a reminder of our past as a naval base.

SEMBAWANG STRIP

The popular dockyard hangout.

Established to provide food and services to workers at the dockyard in the late 1920s, Sembawang Village was known for its bars and eateries. The most famous stretch was a row of shophouses built around 1965, which faced the junction of Admiralty Road East, known as Sembawang Strip. The bars in these shophouses often had naval-themed names such as Golden Hind (a famous ship), Ship Inn, Ship Cabin and Navy's Bar.

KAMPONG TENGAH AND KAMPUNG WAK HASSAN

Old coastal villages.

Established by the British to house Malay dock workers in the 1960s to 1970s, these kampongs were nestled in the wooded coastal area in Sembawang. Today, these coastal villages have been taken over by nature. The only structure that remains is the Masjid Petempatan Melayu Sembawang, built in 1963 as a place of worship for the Muslim community living in Sembawang.

THE JAPANESE THEATRE

📍 150 Gibraltar Crescent

The Dockyard Theatre or the Japanese Theatre is a single-storey building built during World War II. With the passage of time, its use also changed. After the war, the space served as a multi-purpose venue for live performances and badminton games. Eventually, it was used by the Singapore Airlines' Service Quality Centre for corporate bootcamps in the 1990s.

MASJID PETEMPATAN MELAYU SEMBAWANG

📍 27B Jalan Mempurong

A 15-minute walk from the main road, the Masjid Petempatan Melayu Sembawang is set in serene lush greenery. In the 1960s, the mosque was borne out of a kampong effort to raise funds for a physical building. Today, the mosque stays true to its kampong spirit and continues to be active in serving the community.

COLONIAL BUNGALOWS AT SEMBAWANG

📍 Queen's Avenue to Gibraltar Crescent

An iconic reminder of Singapore's colonial past, these black-and-white bungalows are clustered in various parts of Singapore. One such large cluster is at Sembawang, near the Sembawang Shipyard. You can recognise these double storey houses by their high roofs designed to facilitate natural ventilation.

CANBERRA HOUSE (FORMERLY KNOWN AS OLD ADMIRALTY HOUSE)

📍 345 Old Nelson Road

The Canberra House used to be the residence for the Commodore Superintendent of the Royal Navy Dockyard. Since 2002, the two-storey Arts and Craft style house has been gazetted as a national monument and historical landmark.

Today, the new 12-hectare integrated sport and community hub, Bukit Canberra, will provide a myriad of community and lifestyle facilities within a green environment.

HERITAGE BUNKER TRAIL

Uncover the secrets hidden beneath the surface.

1 BERMUDA ROAD BUNKERS

📍 250B Bermuda Road

Just across 250 Bermuda Road are bunkers which could have been used as gun posts. Visitors can also see smaller openings at the side of the bunkers that were perfect for positioning guns.

2 DURBAN ROAD BUNKER

📍 291 Durban Road

The entrance to this bunk has also been sealed but the bunker can be identified by two chimneys at the top mount, near St Andrews community chapel.

3 MALTA CRESCENT BUNKER

📍 Malta Crescent

Find this bunker right next to Sembawang Car Park 2. Although the entrance has been sealed, you can still see markings of the bunker's old helipad.

4 GIBRALTAR CRESCENT BUNKER

📍 Opposite 158 Gibraltar Crescent

Look out for a huge banyan tree engulfing the concrete bunker. Spot this structure easily as you walk up Gibraltar Crescent from Malta Crescent Bunker.

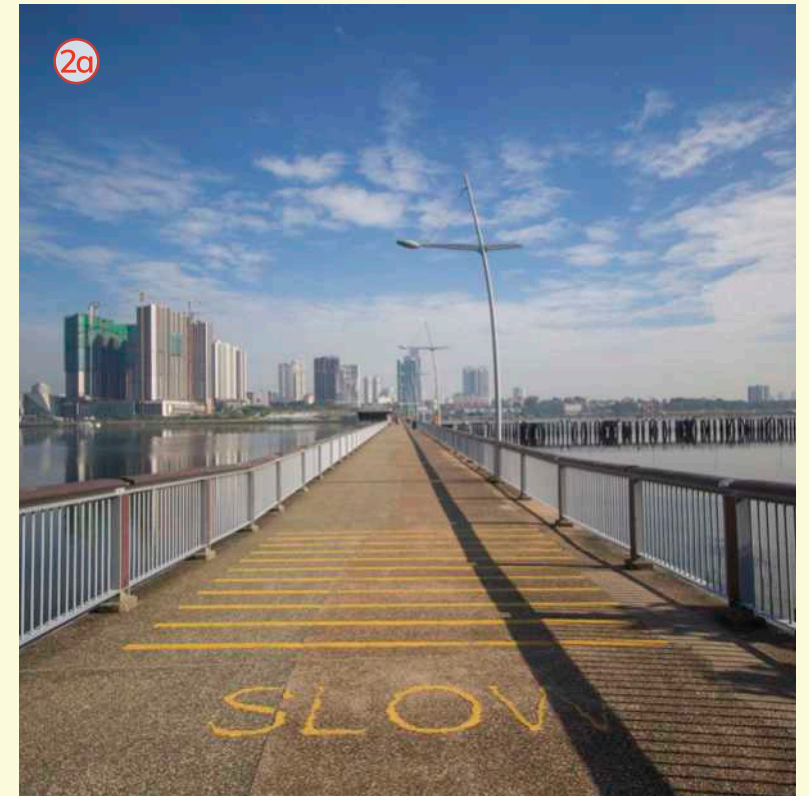

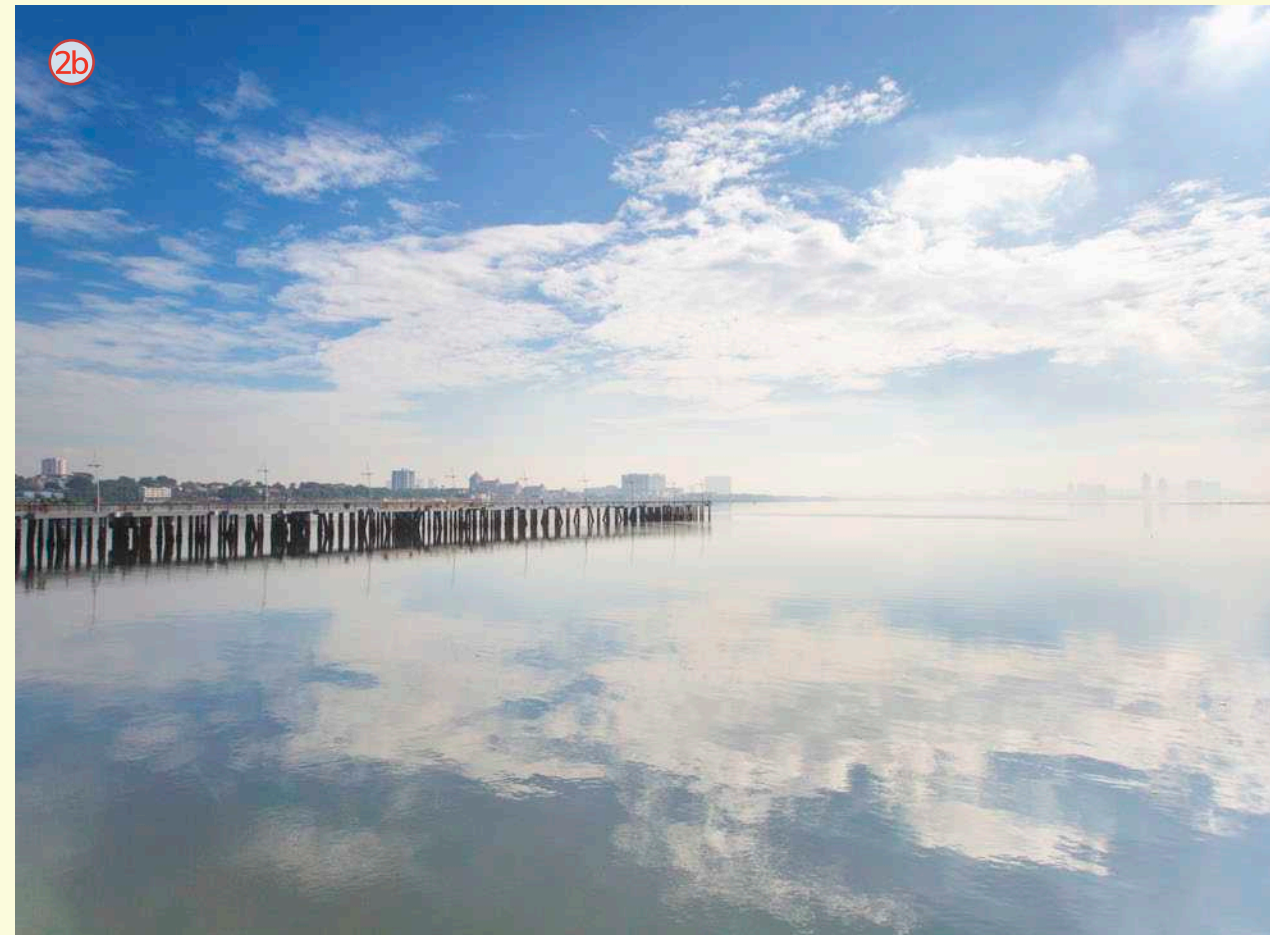

SEMBAWANG GOD OF WEALTH TEMPLE

📍 28 Admiralty Street

Head on down to Sembawang God of Wealth Temple, where visitors can see the iconic 8,290-kilogram God of Wealth gold statue which was built with the help of devotees of the temple. Once a year during the God of Wealth's birthday, devotees can walk around the statue three times to wish for blessings for the whole year.

**DID YOU
KNOW?**

The statue is believed to be the world's largest known God of Wealth statue! It alone cost \$500,000 and was built in China. Eventually, the 3-million-dollar temple was completed in 2006.

SEMBAWANG HOT SPRING

📍 Along Gambas Avenue

Discover Singapore's only hot spring park open to the public! The park features pools, a water collection point and panels for visitors to discover more about the hot spring. The park's fruit trees, plants and flowers commonly found in the 1960s and 1990s recall life in old kampongs and create a homely environment for everyone to enjoy!

1 VISTA PARK

580 Woodlands Drive 16

With facilities such as running tracks, fitness equipment, and its various playgrounds—such as one inspired by Alice In Wonderland—this park is sure to entertain both the young and the old.

2 WOODLANDS WATERFRONT PARK

Admiralty Road West

Linked to the Northern Explorer Loop, this coastal park that has a panoramic view of Malaysia. The 11-hectare park houses a 1.5km-long waterfront promenade with loads to do and see along the coast.

3 JELUTUNG HARBOUR PARK

493 Admiralty Link

Tucked away in the high-rise flats lies a hidden neighbourhood play area which includes a water playground open to the public. Should you choose to stay dry, the park features several playgrounds and exercise areas for everyone to enjoy.

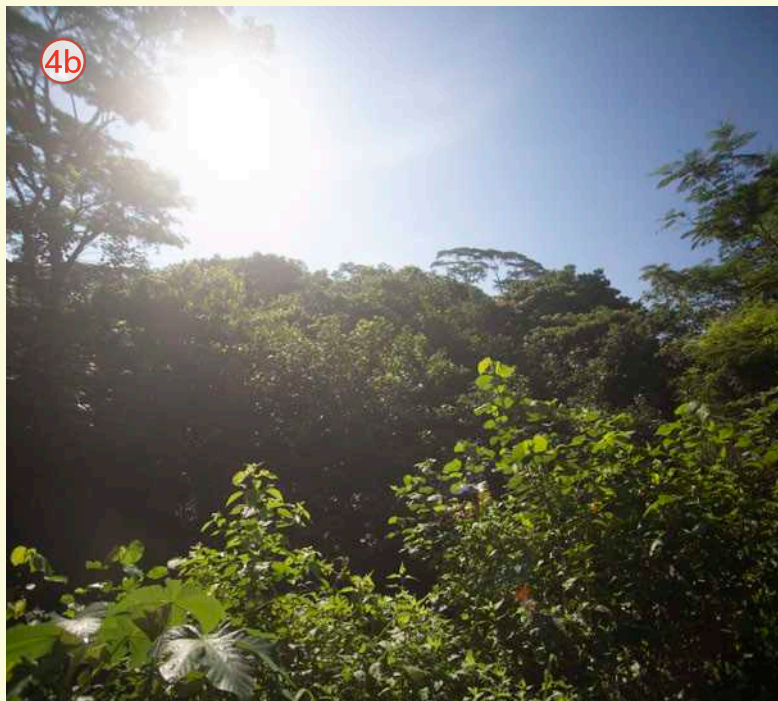

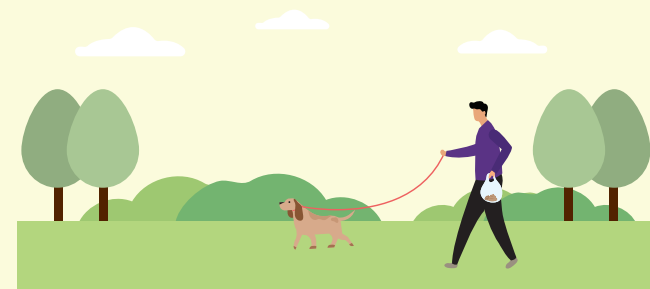

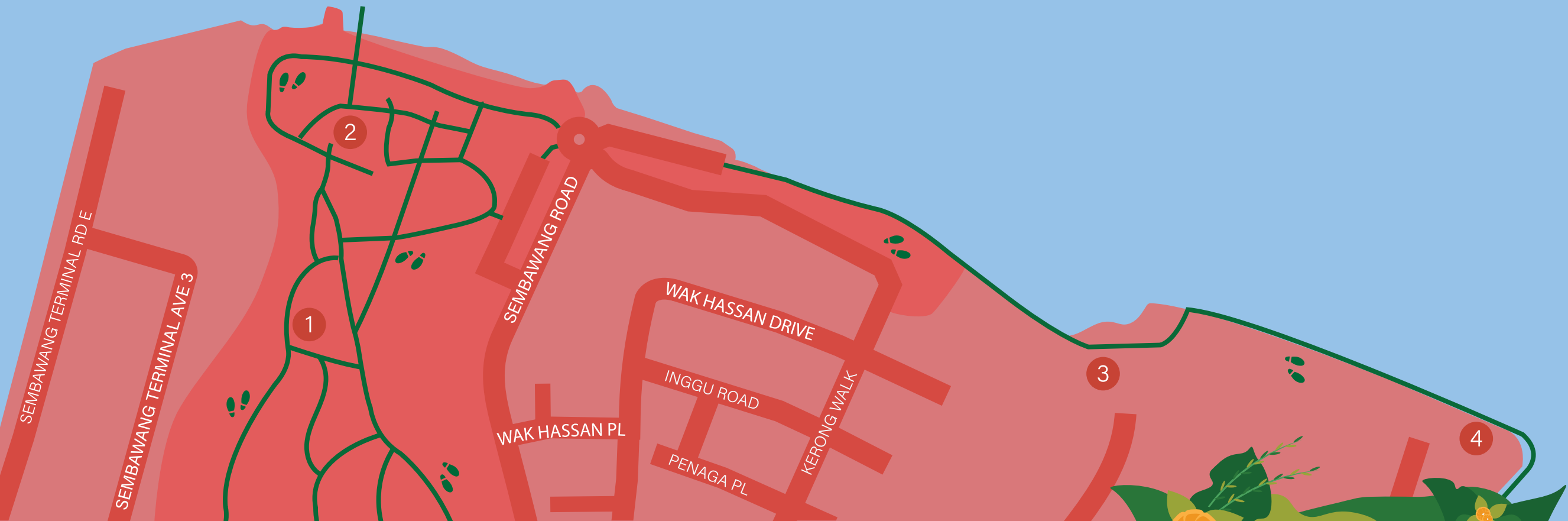
PET-OWNER ETIQUETTE

1 SEMBAWANG PARK

Situated right at the end of Sembawang Road lie a tranquil nature park and natural beaches filled with stories of Singapore's naval heritage. From a maritime themed playground for children to a designated fishing spot for anglers, it's a place of leisure for all.

2 BEAULIEU HOUSE

Enjoy a delicious meal by the sea at this restaurant overlooking the Johor Straits. Once a seaside house that served as a residence for senior fleet officers, the Beaulieu House is one of Sembawang's hidden gems of the North.



3 EAGLES POINT

An unofficial viewpoint with scenic views of the waterfront, this spot on Sembawang Beach (one of the few natural sand beaches left in Singapore) is peaceful and quiet—the perfect spot for a great escape from the city.

4 PASSION WAVE @ SEMBAWANG

If you are feeling adventurous, sign up for a course at Passion WaVe @ Sembawang. With watersport activities like kayaking, you are bound to get the most of the coast here.

Look out for the Park Connector Network (PCN)!

This path continues into other neighbourhoods through an island-wide greenery network known as the Park Connector Network. Look out for the PCN signages and maps as you navigate your way along the roads, scenic rivers and canals that link you to the major parks. Hop on a bicycle or simply jog along the park connectors!



BE A PART OF THE COMMUNITY

GARDENS GIVE BACK! @ SEMBAWANG GRC

A community-driven ground-up initiative, the Gardens Give Back programme was started by community gardeners in Sembawang GRC. They distribute fresh vegetables such as Cai Xin, Nai Bai, Kai Lan, Kang Kong, Old Cucumber, Lady's Finger, Bitter Gourd, and more to senior and low income residents on a monthly basis. The gardeners feel that their harvest should not only be enjoyed by themselves—everyone in the community should be given a chance to bite into some fresh homegrown vegetables.
